

1. Am I going to have to put a meter on my well?

Answer: Initially, the GSA is not proposing meters to be installed. However, if groundwater levels continue to decline and/or the GSA is not meeting its sustainability goal, meters may become necessary in order to quantify usage and identify potential waste and unreasonable use of groundwater.

2. Am I going to be limited on how much I can pump?

Answer: The GSA has experienced historical declines in groundwater levels. The GSA is planning to monitor and manage groundwater on an area-wide basis rather than set and limit groundwater pumping from individual wells. However, the GSP does include potential management actions (such as groundwater pumping restrictions) that could be implemented if the GSA is not on target to meet its sustainability goals. The GSA will also be looking into projects that could (1) gather more data to firm up the overdraft condition and (2) add additional water supply to offset the overdraft condition as necessary.

3. Am I going to have to pay to pump water?


Answer: The GSA may in the near future look to adopt a(n) fee/assessment to cover the cost of administering the GSP (annual reporting, water quality and level sampling, etc.) and to fund potential projects (expansion of water monitoring network, recharge facilities, etc.) to offset the overdraft condition.

4. What are the cities and urban pumpers required to do about groundwater impacts?

Answer: Cities and urban pumpers within the Plan Area have developed groundwater recharge programs to help offset groundwater pumping such as stormwater, recycled water, and wastewater effluent ponds. Both the Cities of Fresno and Clovis have acquired additional surface water supplies and developed water treatment plants to maximize the use of available surface water to lessen their dependence on groundwater.

5. Will the GSP prevent my well from going dry?

Answer: SGMA does not require the GSA to maintain current groundwater levels or prevent individual wells from going dry. Rather, the GSA is required to sustainably manage groundwater levels within the subbasin by 2040.
